How to apply

You should follow the visa application process set out on the ['How to Apply'](#) page of this website. You will **not** be required to submit biometric data but you must make an appointment to attend the visa application centre.

The visa application fees for Commonwealth country and British overseas territory are shown on the ['Visa Application Fees'](#) page on this website. Where a visa application has to be referred to a Commonwealth country or British overseas territory for a decision, an additional fee is charged. For some British overseas territories and Commonwealth countries, visa applications may need to be referred to the territory or country you intend to visit. In cases of referral, the waiting period for approval may take up to 2 months or longer, depending on the country. The UK Border Agency at the British Embassy cannot guarantee that the visas will be issued on time.

Applications for certain British overseas territories and Commonwealth countries can take up to 3 months to process, so please apply well in advance of your travel date. Decisions on these applications are not made by the UK Border Agency - they are sent to the relevant British overseas territory or Commonwealth country for a decision to be made on your application.
